

THE REAL COLORS OF A POODLE



SILVER

The real silver is born black but the hair near the skin is lighter in color which start to appear at approximately 1 month old. As the puppy matures, the hair that grows is very light grey.



BLUE

A blue is born black a kind of dirty black or might even have a brownish tint to the tip of the hair. He will become blue much later at around 2 or 3 years old.



BLACK

A real black will stay black. To determine if it is a real black, look at the hair near the skin, if the hair is the same deep black all the way, you have a real black.



CREAM

A cream when you look at it on its own, it looks like a white but put it beside a real white object, and you will notice it is not pure white.



WHITE

A white is pure. You will never find any nuances in the coat.



SILVER BEIGE

A silver beige puppy is not common. When the hair is cut short, you can see the difference between café au lait and a silver beige. The color of the coat tends to look like the color of cooked liver in short cut and the long hair keeps a brownish redish color.





CAFÉ AU LAIT

A café au lait is a brown of a lighter nuance. Often, their nose is of a lighter brown. When you look closely at the hair near the skin, it is lighter than the brown tips.



BROWN

A real brown is born very dark brown and will fade a shade or two. Look at the hair near the skin, if it is dark all the way, it will stay dark.



APRICOT

There are different shading in the apricots, from light to darker.



RED

The red varies from the color of paprika to a dark orangy. Look at the hair near the skin, if it is dark all the way, you have a real red.
